
- The provision of education and training for students wishing to qualify as Advocates or Solicitors in the Channel Islands.

The Institute of Law houses a special collection of books of historical significance to Jersey's unique legal system. Many of these precious tomes are old, extremely fragile and in need of specialist attention to preserve them for future generations.
